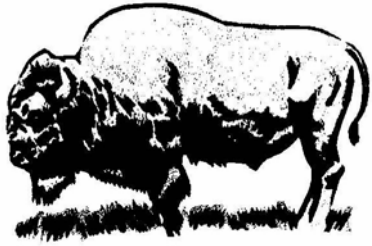

### BVFD Notes



We spent 62 man-hours responding to 20 emergency calls in May. We responded to 15 EMS calls, 1 Structure Fire, 1 Grass Fire, 1 Stranded Boater and 2 Miscellaneous calls for a Gas Leak and Flood Cleanup. The members also spent 24 man-hours performing station and vehicle maintenance with their assigned duty crew.

As the summer heat moves in upon us, here are a few tips to beat the heat:

- ◆ Dress for the heat. Wear lightweight, light-colored clothing. Light colors will reflect away some of the sun's energy. It is also a good idea to wear hats or to use an umbrella.
- ◆ Drink water. Carry water or juice with you and drink continuously even if you do not feel thirsty. Avoid alcohol and caffeine, which dehydrate the body. Avoid using salt tablets unless directed to do so by a physician.
- ◆ Eat small meals and eat more often. Avoid high-protein foods, which increase metabolic heat.
- ◆ Slow down. Avoid strenuous activity. If you must do strenuous activity, do it during the coolest part of the day, which is usually in the morning between 4 and 7 a.m.
- ◆ Stay indoors when possible. If air-conditioning is not available, stay on the lowest floor out of the sunshine. Remember that electric fans do not cool, they simply circulate the air.
- ◆ Be a good neighbor. During heat waves, check in on elderly residents in your neighborhood and those who do not have air conditioning.

### Projects:

Bi-State is working with the City to complete a grant to the State Recreation Trail Program to fund design and environmental work of the Mississippi River Trail. Federal funding from SAFETEA-LU has been identified to fund up to 80 percent of a project to further the development of the Mississippi River Trail in the Muscatine and Scott County Areas. The grant will be completed by the end of the month and hopefully we will know within a few months if the grant is accepted.

The City contracted with MSA engineering to perform a storm outfall evaluation. The evaluation was to determine if the installation of outfall closures would benefit the city during flooding and to determine a cost of the projects. They considered two types of check valves, boot type end (Tideflex) and concrete gate closure structures. The Tideflex are less expensive and could be installed by City Staff. The concrete offers a more reliable closure, but is more expensive and would need to be installed by a contractor. It is noted that neither of these would provide protection if flooding levels exceeded the height of the rail road tracks. We are considering funding through a Multi-Jurisdictional Mitigation Plan for Scott County.

## RED WHITE AND BLUEBERRY SALAD



- 1- container Key-lime yogurt
- 4- teaspoons honey
- 1/4 – teaspoon salt
- 1/2- jicama, peeled, cut into 1/4" slices
- 1-- Bag (10 oz) chopped lettuce
- 2-1/2- cups cubed watermelon
- 1- cup fresh blueberries

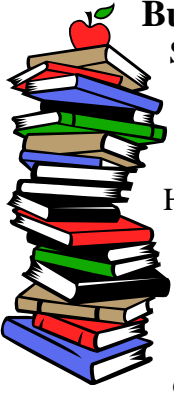
**Step 1-** In small bowl, mix yogurt, honey and salt; set aside. Cut jicama slices into star shapes using a small (1-inch) star-shaped canapé cutter.

**Step 2-** In large bowl, toss remaining ingredients. Pour dressing over salad mixture; toss until well coated. Sprinkle jicama stars over top. Serve immediately.

You can tote this easy salad to a potluck. Pack the dressing and the salad separately, then pour on the dressing just before serving. Refrigerate unused jicama in resealable plastic bag for up to 1 week to use in any summer salad.

## CONGRATULATIONS Dana Jo Smith of Tuf-A-Nuf Stables Buffalo, IA

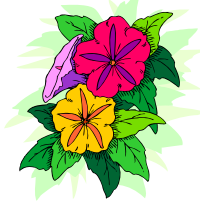
After decades of being an active member with QCABHA (*and other local and national horse clubs*),

## VOLUNTEER PETUNIAS?



Yes, it is true. Beautiful petunias can come up year after year!

For the best success at getting annual flowers to self-sow, plant the flowers in rich soil and do not deadhead the flowers, or at least stop deadheading by the end of July. To create sticking power for the seeds, when you water the flowers, be sure to moisten the ground between the flowers. When the flower's seeds have matured, you can shake the flower on a near windless day to encourage the seeds to drop near the mother plant. Or, to keep with the self-sowing concept, let nature take its course, allowing the seeds (and pod or casing if applicable) to fall where they may. Leave the mother plant all winter to provide shelter over the seed as it dies in the form of plant mulch. The flower seeds will become set in the ground, waiting for the cold of winter to continue their metamorphosis into new seedlings in the spring.
