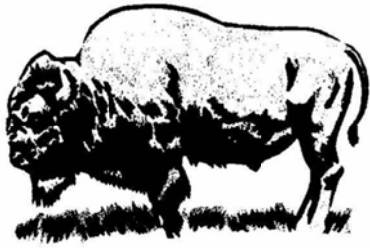

## BVFD Notes



We were Super busy around the BVFD during August. In fact we set a single month record for emergency calls in a month that did not have a natural disaster (flood or storm). We spent 206 man-hours responding to 48 emergency calls in August. We responded to 28 EMS calls, 1 Structure Fire, 1 Vehicle Fire, 5 Vehicle Accidents, 5 Boat Assist Calls, 2 Water Rescues and 6 Miscellaneous calls for Citizen Assists, CO Alarm and Power lines down. The members also spent 21 man-hours performing station and vehicle maintenance with their assigned duty crew.

By the time you read this article, the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the 911 attacks will be but a few days in the past, but I think it is worth the time to mention it again here. The BVFD had the opportunity to participate in the 911 Fire Department Parade, in which all of the fire departments of Scott County had an emergency vehicle parade to each town in the County with stops at each fire station. It was a re-enactment of what we done on the 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary of 911.

There were 2,819 people murdered on that September day in 2001. Of those, 343 were FDNY Firefighters and EMS personnel including the Chief of the Department, 23 were NYPD Police Officers, and 37 Port Authority Police Officers. May they all rest in peace and we shall never forget what they did on that fateful day, September 11, 2001.

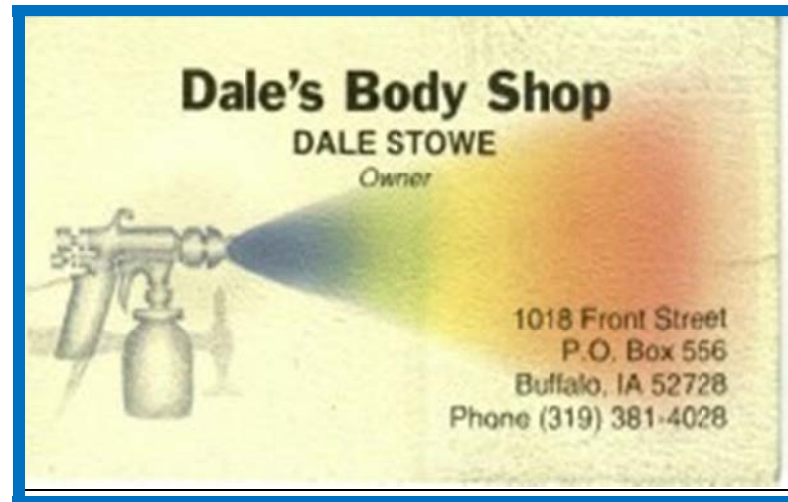

### ELECTRONIC WASTE RECYCLING IN BUFFALO

Residents of the City of Buffalo can now recycle electronic waste (e-waste) free of charge at Waste Commission of Scott County's (Commission) Electronic Demanufacturing Facility in Davenport. The City of Buffalo, which is a member community of Waste Commission of Scott County, was awarded an environmental grant from the Commission to offer this service at no charge to our residents. Residents can deliver e-waste to the Electronic Demanufacturing Facility, 1048 East 59<sup>th</sup> Street in Davenport or at 11555 110<sup>th</sup> Avenue Davenport from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday-Friday. Residents will be required to provide proof of residency in the City of Buffalo to recycle the items at no charge.

Electronic waste is anything with a circuit board or cathode ray tube (CRT) and includes items such as: TVs, computers, monitors, laptops, stereos, radios, VCRs, DVD players, video game equipment, cell phones, printers and scanners.

Electronic waste does **not** include appliances such as refrigerators or microwaves or personal care and household items such as hair dryers and coffee makers. Free recycling applies to residents only. Businesses are charged 20 cents per pound for TVs, computers and laptops. All other electronic waste is free of charge.

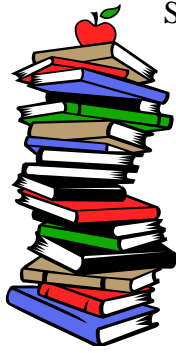

Andrew Carnegie, industrialist, was the richest man in the world during his lifetime (the Bill Gates of his day).

Between 1881 and 1917, Carnegie donated funds to build over 2500 public libraries worldwide. (The original Davenport Public Library was a Carnegie library.) Before he died in 1919, he gave away virtually his entire fortune to charitable works.
